A few things first

Ruddington village with its local history and great park is a fantastic destination for our latest Bus Detective. Take the Green 10 from town or the Navy 3 from Clifton to Ruddington Green and get going!

The route is suitable for pushchairs and wheelchairs and takes a flat route around the village, though care should be taken when crossing the roads. There are plenty of opportunities to stop for a cuppa and cake. You could also pop in to one of the village's museums, the country park or enjoy a browse in the dozens of small, independent shops the village has to offer.

How to get here:

Take the Green 10 from town (and travel on one of our shiny new gas buses) or the Navy 3 from Clifton to Ruddington Green.





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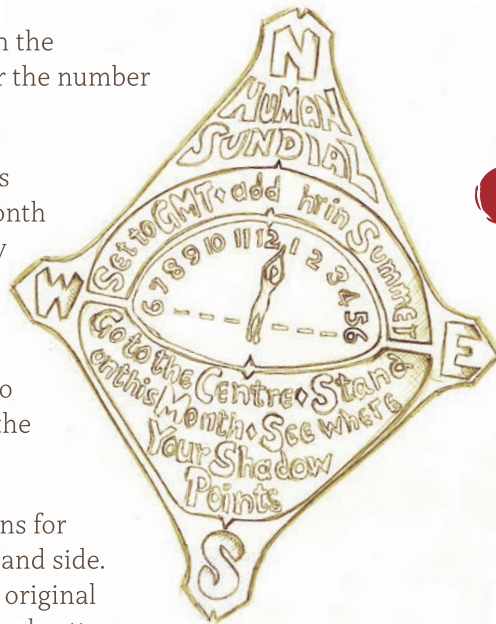
1. Your first clue can be found at the bus stop on the Ruddington Village Green timetable. Look for the number in the Bus Detective magnifying glass.

2. Head over to the Human Sundial. If the sun is shining, stand on the plate at the relevant month and use your body to tell the time! How many hours do you need to add in the summer?

3. Backtrack to the bus stop, then continue to the junction. You need to turn right here on to Church Street. What year was the chapel on the left hand side restored? 19__.

4. Continue along Church Street. You'll pass signs for the Framework Knitters Museum on the left hand side. This small, unspoilt museum is housed in an original 400 year old Framework Knitters' workshop and cottage. It has innovative displays, an attractive garden, cosy tea room and shop. As you head towards the Co-Op, across the road you'll see the Methodist Church. What year was it built? 18__.

5. Carry on past the Co-op. (turn left here down Vicarage Lane to see Shaw Street Cemetery if you wish. It contains the graves of three of the survivors who defended the Rorke's Drift). Follow the road round to the right. On your left is St Peter's Church. Much of the current Grade II listed Gothic style building dates from 1824 but it retains the chancel and steeple from the ancient fabric. Which day in October did the Archbishop of York visit Ruddington?

6. Returning back to the road continue to the War Memorial on your left. How many steps are there leading up to the memorial?

You can catch the bus from this bus stop into town to claim your sleuth sticker!



Extend your walk!

Turning left down Asher Lane will take you to Rushcliffe Country Park, a 210 acre open park space, with over five miles of footpaths. Around a quarter of a million visitors a year stroll around the pretty park and lake. Watch the varied wildlife, explore the woodland trails, find out about its military past or make use of the many outdoor recreational facilities, including an extensive children's play area. There's an Education Centre where youngsters can learn about conservation and where refreshments are sometimes available. There's even an al fresco gym and table tennis. Entry to Rushcliffe Country Park is free.
