How to get here:

Catch Green 5, 6, 7, 8 or 9 buses from Lower Parliament Street, opposite into Victoria Centre or Angel Row near The Bell. You'll need to get off at the Co-Op stop to start your adventure!



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WEST BRIDGFORD

1. Catch the Green 5, 6, 7, 8 or 9 to the Co-Op stop near West Bridgford Library. Your first clue is on the timetable at this bus stop.
2. Walk along Bridgford Road, take a look at the library doors - how many swirls are above the doors?
3. Continue past the library and enter the park through the ornate gates. On your right is a kiosk and toilets (20p charge). How many types of tree are there carved into the tree trail plaque?
4. Follow the map and head to the play park. How many slides are there?
5. With the play park to your right continue walking. How many chairs are there in the reading area?
6. Turn right at the t-junction and continue walking to your next clue. What number is the hawthorn tree?

7. Turn right again and keep your eyes peeled for the Whitebeam tree. How many lion heads are there on the nearby bench?
8. Turn left towards the gate then take the path on the right just before the gates and follow it around the outskirts of the park. Find the Turkey Oak tree and add the two numbers together for your next clue.
9. Continue along the path, with the car park on your left. Keep walking until you can see Alfresco Caffé on your left where you'll find toilets (20p charge) and the kiosk serving drinks and ice creams.
10. Your last clue is at the bus stop on Central Avenue. Walk out of the park, turn left and take care crossing the road. You'll find the bus stop outside Boots. Catch Green 5, 6, 7, 8 or 9 buses back into town.



Did you know?

Bridgford Park is home to Bridgford Hall, a beautiful Grade II listed building dating back to 1768!
